Dear Friend in Christ,

In the month of Feb starting February 26 we will be in the holy season of Lent. Let this year's holy season of Lent be one to find out what is missing in our lives. To some it may be our patience or our integrity, or caring for others. If these areas are yours then decide on some discipline to recover them. But an important missing one that we need to recover most is - **Believing God's Promises**.

All of us during our lifetime will at one time or another be in pain and want relief, afraid and want assurance or have worries, and uncertainty about the future and want clarity. But what if God does reach out and send us a message of hope to help us combat even the worst of our life's challenges. What will be our reactions?



Do we take God as a God true to His Promises? And that His promises have the power to calm our storms, incite miracles, and best of all, deliver us. And His promises can provide those things from breakthroughs to peace, children, marriage, jobs, joy, healing, direction, and much more as we saw clearly in the Scripture.

So, do we take that God's promises can be counted on and really make a difference? If we doubt, here are some powerful prayer experiences regarding the promises of God. Here are some of these assurances. **Allow God to plant each promise into our hearts so that we can soon reap the fruit of His promises.**

1. Numbers 6:24-26 says *"The Lord will bless you and watch over you. The Lord will smile on you and be kind to you. The Lord will look on you with favour and give you peace."*
2. Psalm 91:3-7 *"For He Will rescue you from every trap and protect you from deadly disease. He will cover you with His feathers. He will shelter you with His wings.... Do not be afraid of the terrors of the night, nor the arrow that flies in the day.....these evils will not touch you."*
3. Psalm 145:13 *"The Lord always keeps his promises; he is gracious in all he does."*
4. Josh 23:14 *"You know with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the Lord your God gave you has failed. Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed."*

Inevitably, as soon as we read and pray the Scripture verses, a deep level of trust and comfort begin to rise in our spirit.
Everything will be all right!

Isn't this a wonderful realisation! However for God's Promises to happen we need it would seem, aren't wrought by just acknowledging it.



We need to have Persistence in prayer. As Psalm 145 28-19 says *“The Lord is near to everyone who prays to him, to every faithful person who prays to him. He fills the needs of those who fear him. He hears their cries for help and saves them.”* And in Lk 11:9-10 Jesus reminded *“And so I tell you, keep on asking, and you will receive what you ask for. Keep on seeking, and you will find. Keep on knocking, and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives. Everyone who seeks, finds. And to everyone who knocks, the door will be opened.”*



So aren't we more sure now to constantly pray for God's promises. Hope, all of us would cling to these promises, all of which demonstrate that God is in the mood to say Yes to us.

To conclude as we reflect on the goodness of God's promises, **recall the ways God has kept His promise to us.** Then pray like this:

Dear Lord,

Thank you for these promises. I say yes and agree with them and believe they are for me. Give me even more faith to believe as I cling to your Word. I pray this in the power of the name of Jesus. Yes and Amen.
